DISTRICT #11/12 3-5 MILES DUE NORTH OF TOWN, ENCOMPASSING THE CROSS ANCHOR AND ROARING FORK AREAS

NOTE 1: JOHN MALONEY SR., BECAUSE OF HIS ADVANCED AGE, APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN EXEMPTED FROM THE CIVIL DISTRICTS ROSTER.

NOTE 2: ROBERT MALONEY OWNS LAND IN SEVERAL PARTS OF GREENE COUNTY. DISTRICT 1 AND 2 ARE IN THE EXTREME SOUTHERN AREA OF GREENE COUNTY NEAR CAMP AND MIDDLE CREEKS. DISTRICT 12 IS IN THE CROSS ANCHOR/ROARING FORK AREA WHERE ROBERT AND CATHERINE COOPER MALONEY HAD THEIR FARM. BY 1836, ROBERT HAD RETIRED FROM THE TAILOR SHOP.

NOTE 3: ROBERT'S SON, JOHN, IS LIVING IN THE TOWN OF GREENEVILLE WHERE HE OPERATES THE MALONEY HOTEL.
